Margaret Olley to become a Patron of Maitland Regional Art Gallery

In November 2004 Council supported the appointment of patrons for the Maitland Regional Art Gallery (MRAG) with distinguished art collectors James Agapitos OAM and Ray Wilson OAM being appointed founding patrons.

Mr Agapitos and Mr Wilson achieved international renown for putting together the most comprehensive collection of Australian Surrealist art ever assembled. Their generosity of spirit saw a number donations including 285 works to the National Gallery of Australia and great assistance and gifts to regional galleries including our own MRAG. Sadly Mr Agapitos passed away in January 2007.

Our City is fortunate that one of Australia's most distinguished living artists and philanthropists, Margaret Olley AC AO, has agreed to become a patron of our gallery to serve alongside Mr Wilson.

Born in Lismore in 1923, Margaret Olley is one of Australia's most prized interior and still life painters. Demonstrating a fierce disregard for trends and fashions, Olley's exquisite arrangements of flowers, fruit and objects seduce the viewer with their technical virtuosity and inherent grace. Her arrangements are always elegant, the objects always beautiful. Complexities of space and light are rendered with consummate skill.

Olley's subjects are almost always from her own home - itself famous as an exquisite work of art. She first came to public attention as the beguiling subject of Dobell's winning Archibald portrait in 1948, and these days is regarded as a national treasure as an artist and for her philanthropic work and assistance to emerging artists. In 1997 her work was the subject of a major retrospective organised by the Art Gallery of New South Wales.

In the short history of MRAG Margaret Olley has favoured our gallery with her encouragement and through the donation of works by a number artists including Judy Cassab. It is a great honour that we can now claim her formally as Patron.

MRAGM featured artist Cressida Goddard

Cressida has been working at Maitland Regional Art Gallery (MRAG) for the past four years. In that time her role has evolved from gallery attendant to designer (or web mistress which she is affectionately known as) for MRAG.

Cressida has been part of the Newcastle art scene for over 10 years. She began her studies in fine art at the University of Newcastle in 1995 and graduated from a Master of Fine Art (MFA) in April this year.

Her work is digitally based and looks at the body and technology and how they interact. Beneath the Skin was the title of her MFA thesis and exhibition shown at Newcastle's John Paynter Gallery in July/August 2007. The exhibition consisted of a wall projection of images of the body, technology and a fusion of the two.

Cressida wrote in the exhibition catalogue; "Beneath the skin lies the extraordinary workings of the human body. Flesh, bones, and organs collaborate to sustain life. The complexity of the inner body is echoed within technology, as programming code seamlessly maintains the existence of the interface.


Beyond the surface of the body is a world we rarely see. It is a world always with us, but remains mysterious and intangible. Beyond the surface of the screen, or the skin of software, is another world seldom seen. This world is enclosed by the user interface and is mostly hidden from view.

Beneath the skin takes us on an imaginary journey inside the layers of the body and technology."


The imagery was accompanied by a disturbing soundtrack of the human breath coupled with industrial sounds.

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Art Gallery Receives Promotions Boost

Maitland Regional Art Gallery (MRAG) will now be able to further support local talent and boost its promotions effort with the appointment of a graphic designer. The position, filled by local graduate Cressida Goddard, was made possible by a generous \$20,000 donation from the Donaldson Job Creation Trust.

According to Executive Director of Donaldson, Leigh McPherson, Donaldson Coal established the Donaldson Job Creation Trust with the intention of assisting the local community and to encourage investment in the regional area. He said, "Donaldson Job Creation Trust made a commitment to support the local community. It's important that qualified and trained individuals remain in the Hunter Valley employment pool".

Cressida Goddard has recently graduated from the University of Newcastle with a Masters Degree. She will be responsible for redesigning the corporate branding

for MRAG which includes a new web site, an all new corporate look including new banners, flyers and the designing of specific catalogues and publications for MRAG.


