LOOK UP

Picasso's *Imaginary Portrait* series, 1969 to see what he created

MATERIALS

paper, magazines, junk mail, scissors, glue, black paint, texta, crayons or pencils

1.

Cut shapes and pictures out of coloured paper, magazines or junk mail you have at home.

You could also make your own coloured shapes with texta and pencils then cut them out or make it up as you go.

2.

Arrange the shapes onto a piece of plain paper. You can overlap as you like.

Can you imagine a face in the picture?

3.

Use black lines to draw an outline of a face on top of your coloured paper arrangement.

Try using different shapes in a style like Picasso's *Imaginary Portrait* 10.
