CREATING YOUR ART WORK


1. GATHER your materials.

For this activity you will need:

- A few sheets of white A4 paper
- An A4 sheet of coloured paper or thin card
- Some textas & coloured pencils
- Some scissors
- A glue stick
- 2. ADAPT whatever materials you have if you need to. What do you have lying around the house you could use instead? Paper bags? Fabric scraps? Look through your recyclable cardboard!
- **3. FOLD** one sheet of white A4 paper in half like you are making a card for someone! In pencil, draw a simple head shape and a neck. With the paper still folded in half, cut out two heads.
- **4. GLUE** the two heads onto your A4 coloured paper or card.









5. 0N your other sheets of white paper, draw and colour multiple facial features i.e., eyes, eyebrows, noses, mouths, tongues, ears, whatever you like!! Remember that you will need 4 sets of eyes, eyebrows, and ears to make it like Thom's portrait.

Think about happy AND serious

Think about happy AND serious shapes when you are drawing the mouth and eyebrows.

Draw some different hairstyles as well, maybe some accessories like glasses and earrings!

6. CUT out all your coloured pieces and have fun arranging them on your heads...

What looks the most appealing? What looks the funniest? Or the most serious? Do they look like anyone you know?

7. WHEN you are happy with your layout, glue all your pieces down.

TURN THIS ACTIVITY INTO A FUN GAME!

Get your siblings or even your whole family to join in and make one big face!

Cut out one BIG head/face shape on plain paper and on SEPARATE pieces of paper ask everyone to draw some facial features, hair, and some accessories.

Everyone can have fun cutting out the pieces together.

Then grab a die/dice and whoever rolls the highest score on each round gets to glue a piece on the face.

See what funny face you can come up with! Maybe make a few and make your own portrait gallery!
