Gallery grounds:	The art gallery has a sensory garden and grassed areas as part of the grounds of the complex. These areas are open to the public. Rubbish bins are located on the grounds. Access to these grounds is during gallery open times, accessible via vehicle entrance and side pedestrian entrance via James st, and pedestrian entrance on High St.

Do all staff working with children have valid Working With Children Checks?	Yes	
Are venue staff appropriately qualified/ trained for working with children?	Yes. Yes. MRAG Staff and Art Tutors who work with children undergo MRAG Induction and have professional Teaching and Visual Arts qualifications and experience.	
Is there unguarded equipment present?	All dangerous materials (eg cleaning products and chemicals) are kept in areas out of public access. Parents and caregivers must stay with their dependent children at all times, ensuring correct usage of equipment available for use by the public (chairs, tables, children's art space furniture, art).	
Are adequate first aid materials available?	Yes. First aid kits are kept in workshop areas and at Front of House. There is an AED, Automated External Defibrillator, located at Front desk, with MRAG staff trained in its use.	
Are there unguarded water features present?	Yes. Sensory garden, located on the James St side of the gallery complex accessible via the rear gallery grounds and doors leading off the café, contains water fountains that could potentially be of risk to young children. Fountains are in plain view from gallery café space, but caregivers must not leave their children unattended.	
Are workshops and children's activities appropriately	Yes. MRAG Learning and Audience Development Curators oversee the development of activities and programs for

Venue Lighting and Sound		
Are all pathways and access areas well lit?	Yes, however some exhibitions may have low lighting due to nature of exhibit. Large glass panels add good amounts of natural light.	
Is there a hearing loop available?	Yes.	
Are emergency alarms both visual and aural?	We have aural but not visual. The visual would be the wardens with their caps moving people along.	
Is there a moderate to high level of background noise?	No, however some exhibitions may have moderate noise associated.
